Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Basically the home today is as it was in 1889, both interior and exterior, and it is still a single family residence.

The exterior of the house is an "Arts and Crafts" style. Irregular roofline above the shingled facade gives this house and unusual air, a bay window has the shingle facade extended as mansard eaves. It is steeply gabled and has a broken roofline, variegated shingle and clapboard siding. The jigsaw decoration on the porch is similar to that of the house next door, West 2128 Second Avenue, which Mr. David Fotheringham also built two years later. The body of the house is "Stick" style with clapboard. The Stick style was was a unique American product which was popular between the 1870's and about 1900. this type of architecture, exterior decorative boards are used to outline the structure. Stick style houses are asymmetrical in massing and include a variety of surface textures. The siding is horizontal, broken into panels enclosed by flat wood trim. probably rested in the revival movement the style developed apart from it. origin is debatable, however, it does have the elements of Swiss Chalet, Queen Anne,

English half-timbering, and the French Country Cottage effect.

There is a small front porch which leads to the entrance hall. The entrance hall has original woodwork, a small window with original frosted etched glass. its original wind-up doorbell and transom. The hall features its original hanging light on a heavy brass chain. Leading to the East from the entrance hall is what is now the music room but at one time was a parlor. This room has three lovely seven foot windows fronted by a window seat. It features original woodwork and one inch wide hardwood Lovely gold Art Nouveau molding placed at the nine foot level of the walls, A gorgeous Art Nouveau chandelier with original hand-painted shades hangs from the center of the room. Leading from this room into the formal dining room, are huge nine foot folding doors with original gold wood beading. The dining room is much like the music room and features an original chanedlier, seven foot windows, and a window From here you enter into a dreamland of a living-room which is really hard to Leading into the living-room is a lovely doorway with a transom. This room has the original woodwork with gold wooden beading outlining the room. The flooring changes into two inch hardwood flooring and steps up slightly from the dining room floor. A beautiful brass chandelier similar to a knight's shield contains shades which are dated The fireplace is elevated and much like one in the Patrick Clark mansion with small Roman brick. The fireplace has side nitches of dark wood and fancy columns. There are two lead glass French windows and French doors leading onto the enclosed veranda. Upon leaving the living-room, you pass through the dining room and into a small hall. There on the left is the library and a small downstairs bath which very possibly was a closet originally. The main bath is upstairs with its very large original clawfoot oversized bathtub and pedestal sink. The upstairs has a very large master bedroom with French windows, a large hallway, and one smaller bedroom. There are seven closets, three of which are cedar lined and walk-ins. One average sized bedroom is downstairs. All of the doors in an on the house have beautiful Art Nouveau hardware. The kitchen has a pantry with window that opens like a door. The kitchen also has what used to be a dumb-waiter and could easily be turned back into one. It now serves as a storage space. The kitchen also has the original wainscotting around the walls and a chimney in working order capable of once again serving a wood cookstove. There is a half-basement with a coal furnace, a coal bin for the 12 tons of coal the family uses per year, and a fruit room.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

This historic structure is located at West 2124 Second Avenue in historic Browne' Addition. The paracel of land now known as Browne's Addition was obtained by J.J. Brown from the Unites States government in 1883.

This Arts and Crafts style single family residence is consided a primary structure on the Browne's Addition National Historic District.

The house was built by David B. Fotheringham in 1889. Mr. Fotheringham was the first mayor of the newly named city, Spokane. (Charter changed in 1891). He took office the same day, April 4, 1891, the city's name changed. Mayor Fotheringham was an active and progresive mayor. He was sen as a fair and honorable individual who enhanced the office and title. As well as mayor, he was an entrepeneur, politican, and contractor who built the house directly West, at 2128 W. Second Ave., as well as the Patrick Clark mansion (for K.K. Cuter), the Spokane County Courthouse, and several other important Spokane structures. David B. Fotheringham was involved in the real estate speculation which seemed to be popular in those days. Fotheringham died on June 26, 1930.

Thh 1897 owner, Mabel Cotter Williamson, a well known retired Madam who was very successful in her line of business activities, owned the house until her death in 1958. The James L. Red family bought the house in 1964. Mrs. Red is a retired entertainer.
